Jane (Rhys' wife) taught English language to Healthcare staff. This is very important for us as our clinic becomes more of an international facility. Jane is very patient and kind to people around her.

We are very glad to see Jan B coming back to Healthcare after a refreshing holiday. The Parent's Learning Clinic opens again this month. Jan is so encouraged to see the improvement of some of Cerebral Palsy Children. In addition, a new CP child has come to us asking for help. The four year old child is named Qiqi. In the past 2 years, the family has spent all their money for expensive treatment in a local hospital. They have no idea what they should do for their son. Some of their friends and relatives suggest them to abandon the child, but the parents are struggling about it. Jan encourages them to keep

the children at home and Healthcare will provide the continuous treatment for this poor child. It brings a new hope for the family. Please be thinking of the child and the family.
